## LET US KEEP OUR CITY CLEAN AND SAFE

Did you know that according to the **Street and Traffic Regulations**, 1930 (GN 9 of 1930), it is an offence to do the following?

- Litter or dump waste in streets or public spaces.
- Transport uncovered waste that could cause pollution or littering.
- Leave waste behind after being told to clean it up.
- Throw fireworks or anything dangerous in public areas.
- Use or display items that could harm or annoy people, animals, or traffic.

Littering is punishable by law and may result in a fine of **N\$ 750.00**.

Do your part, comply with the law and keep our streets clean and safe for everyone.
